

1 RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL
2 (Juvenile Detention Officer Project)

3 RES. NO. 25-79
4

5 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has been carrying out a Juvenile Justice
6 Program for its youth, and

7 WHEREAS, the Papago Juvenile Detention Officer project has been
8 identified as a priority in the Juvenile Justice Program;

9 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribe is fully
10 supportive and endorses the continuation of the Papago
11 Juvenile Detention Officer project as a means of
12 developing and improving the quality of juvenile justice
13 on the Papago Reservation.

14 LET IT ALSO BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribe, through the
15 Administration will use the funds only for the purpose
16 as stated.


17 LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribe request a waiver
18 of any required cash match and will provide any necessary
19 documents as needed by the Arizona State Justice Planning
20 Agency.

21 LET BE FINALLY BE RESOLVED, that the Chairman, or his designee, is
22 authorized to carry out the responsibility of providing
23 documents, negotiating terms, and signing all necessary
24 papers from application through completion of project
25 funds.

27 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago
28 Council on the 9th day of April, 1979, at a meeting
29 at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1031 for;
30 0 against; 34 not voting; and 2
31 absent, pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by
32 Sections 2(a) and (m) and 3(h) and (l) of Article V of the
Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe, ratified by the
Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the

1 Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of
2 June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of
3 the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago
4 Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
