

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 26-79

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has recognized its duty to provide for
2 administration of justice for all people residing on the
3 Papago Reservation;

4 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has provided for the establishment of
5 Tribal Court Systems to administer and adjudicate cases;

6 WHEREAS, the Tribal Court System is in need of establishing a
7 Tribal Prosecutor's Office to handle all criminal
8 complaints filed in the Tribal Court and to hire a
9 Probation Officer;

10 WHEREAS, there are no tribal funds to fund and set up the Tribal
11 Prosecutor's Office, or to fund a Probation Officer
12 Position and outside funding is necessary;

13 WHEREAS, the Arizona State Justice Planning Agency has announced
14 that there is FY-79 funds available for Indian Tribes who
15 submit applications;

16 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribe is fully
17 supportive and endorses the Tribal Prosecutor's Office
18 and Probation Officer position a means of developing and
19 improving the quality of justice on the Papago Reservation.

20 LET IT ALSO BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribe, through the
21 Administration, will use the funds only for the purpose
22 as stated.

23 LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Papago Tribe request a
24 waiver of any required cash match and will provide any
25 necessary documents as needed by the State Justice
26 Planning Agency.

27 LET IT FINALLY BE RESOLVED, that the Chairman, or his designee, is
28 hereby authroized to carry out the responsibility of
29 providing documents, negotiating terms, and signing all
30 necessary papers from application through completion of
31 project funds.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 6th day of April, 1979, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1031.0 for; 0 against; 34 not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Sections 2 (a) and (m) and 3 (h) and (l) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
