RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL (Compensation for Visiting Judges)

RES. NO. 27-79 1 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has an obligation to provide for the 2 administration of justice for all members of the Papago 3 Tribe; and WHEREAS, the Papago Council has established the tribal court system 4 5 and appointed tribal judges to administer justice on the 6 Papago Reservation; and 7 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has recognized that in certain cases 8 tribal judges may be disqualified to hear a matter, but 9 has not authorized the tribal court system to allow 10 judges from other court systems to sit as hearing judges; 11 and 12 WHEREAS, the Indian Civil Rights Act of 1968 guarantees to all 13 individuals due process and equal protection of the 14 law. 15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that in order to ensure fairness 16 to all individuals coming before the tribal court 17 systems, judges from other court systems will be 18 authorized to sit as presiding judges over cases 19 wherein all the Papago Tribal Court Judges have been 20 disqualified for cause; 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that funds be appropriated to compensate 22 any visiting judge who presides over a case in the 23 Papago Tribal Court. 24 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 6 day of April, 1979 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 841 for; 143 against; 81 not voting; 25 81 not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 3(b) of Article V of the Constitution and By-26 Laws of the Papago Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 27 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 28 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject 29 to review by the Secretary of the Interior. 30
