

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL  
(Authorizing a P.L. 93-638 Grant Application to IHS)

RES. NO. 2-79

1 WHEREAS, on 7 August 1978, the Papago Council passed Res. No. 43-78 which  
2 authorized a grant application to the Environmental Protection  
3 Agency for Section 208 Water Quality Continuing Planning Funds;  
4 and

5 WHEREAS, said grant requires a 25% "local matching share" which will total  
6 \$12,349 and which is not now available from general Tribal budget;  
7 and

8 WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service has Public Law 93-638 grant funds avail-  
9 able for use at Papago which can legally be used to provide the  
10 required local matching share


11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does authorize  
12 submission of a grant application to the Indian Health Service,  
13 for grant funds totaling \$12,349 which are to be used as local  
14 matching share for the EPA 208 grant;

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council does authorize and direct the  
16 Chairman, or in his absence the Vice Chairman or Treasurer to  
17 negotiate and execute said grant agreement and any amendment  
18 thereto during the term of the grant;

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said grant application shall include indirect  
20 cost funds to assist with the required Tribal Government opera-  
21 tions, said funds to be in the amount authorized in negotiations  
22 between Indian Health Service and the Papago Tribe.


23 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the  
24 5th day of January, 1979, at a meeting at which a quorum was present  
25 with a vote of 1011 for; 54 against; 0 not voting; and  
26 2 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by Sections  
27 (a), (c) and (m) of Article II of the Constitution and By-laws of the  
28 Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 14, 1936,  
29 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant  
30 to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). of the Interior  
31 and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
