

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBE
(Rodeo & Fair)

RES. NO. 37-79

1 WHEREAS, Ordinance Number 4 of the Papago Tribe, enacted by the
2 Papago Council on January 7, 1939, authorized the Papago
3 Fair and Rodeo Association, the affairs of which were to
4 be managed by a Board of Directors, the members of which
5 were appointed by the Papago Council.

6 WHEREAS, the Ordinance states among other provisions, the powers
7 and duties of the Board of Directors to conduct annually
8 an event called the Papago Fair, Livestock Show, and Rodeo.

9 WHEREAS, Section 4(e) of the said Ordinance states: "The Treasurer
10 of the Papago Fair and Rodeo Association shall accept,
11 receipt for, keep, and safeguard all funds of the As-
12 sociation. He shall deposit all such funds in the name
13 of the Association, subject to his checking account, in a
14 bank insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation,
15 and located in Tucson, Arizona, to be selected by the
16 Board of Directors, and shall make and preserve a faithful
17 record of such funds and shall report on all receipts and
18 expenditures and the amount and nature of all funds in his
19 possession or custody, to the Board of Directors of the
20 Association, at meetings of the Board, or at such other
21 times as requested by the Board, his reports to be in
22 writing and matters of record. He shall give a satisfactory
23 surety bond to the Association in the Sum of \$2,000.00,
24 and shall not pay or otherwise disburse any funds in the
25 possession or custody of the Papago Fair and Rodeo Associ-
26 ation except when properly authorized to do so by resolution
27 duly passed by the Board of Directors of the Association.."

28 WHEREAS, Section 7 of said Ordinance states: "All contributions,
29 admission fees, concession fees, receipts from Association-
30 operated amusement devices and concessions, entry fees,
31 and miscellaneous collections and receipts, shall be promptly
32 deposited in the designated depository, to the credit of the

Association and shall be available for expenditure under proper authorization of the Board of Directors, for carrying out the purposes of this ordinance....."

WHEREAS, the Papago Rodeo and Fair had been established by the Papago Council as an activity of the Papago Tribe, wholly-owned and operated explicitly for the welfare, morals, and benefits of the Papago people. That an activity duly authorized and established as an entity of the Papago Tribe of necessity must operate according to its Ordinances/Resolutions, to include accountability for funds, equipment and other assets.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that any and all funds on hand, on deposits in separate checking accounts and/or savings accounts or invested in any securities, bearing the names of the Papago Fair and Rodeo Association, any member of its Board of Director and/or Rodeo and Fair, be immediately placed under the custody of the Treasurer of the Papago Tribe. Further, that any and all funds received incident to the annual Papago Fair, Livestock Show, and Rodeo be promptly turned into the Treasurer of the Papago Tribe for deposit to the Tribal General Fund Checking Account, and that all funds received by and administrative and operating expenses incurred by or on behalf of the Papago Rodeo and Fair activity be accounted for by the Tribal Treasurer in the same manner as for other Tribal-owned funds. That, the provisions of this Resolution are controlling where they contravene any Ordinances/Resolutions enacted by the Papago Council, those affecting fund management and accountability by Rodeo and Fair activity, Fair and Rodeo Association, and/or its Board of Directors.

1 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
2 the 11th. day of May, 1979, at a meeting at which a quorum was
3 present with a vote of 878.5 for; 0 against; 186.5 not
4 voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the
5 Council by Section 4 (a) of Article I of the Constitution and By-
6 Laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe
7 on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior
8 on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18,
9 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by
10 the Secretary of Interior and is effective as of the date of its
11 enactment by the Papago Council.
