

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL  
(International Boundary Fence)

RES. NO. 42-79

1 WHEREAS, the Chukut Kuk District has received and made numerous  
2 complaints concerning the operation and maintenance of  
3 the International Boundary fence; and has requested the  
4 Papago Council to investigate such complaints and support  
5 the District in seeking resolutions thereof; and

6 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has made such an investigation,

7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council finds:

- 8 1. That the International Boundary fence is in need  
9 of immediate repair or replacement.
- 10 2. That it would substantially reduce the intentional  
11 cutting of the fence and the resulting straying of  
12 Papago and Mexican livestock across the border if  
the existing gates were left unlocked.
- 13 3. That individual fences on the Mexican side of the  
14 border connecting to the International Boundary fence  
are placed there illegally and should be removed.

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairman and other appropriate  
16 officers, agents and attorneys of the Papago Council are  
17 hereby authorized and directed to work with the Bureau  
18 of Indian Affairs and such other departments or agencies  
19 of the Federal or Mexican governments responsible for,  
20 or having jurisdiction over the International Boundary fence  
21 in order to accomplish the purposes of this Resolution.

22 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on  
23 the 14th. day of May, 1979, at a meeting at which a quorum was  
present with a vote of 962 for; 0 against; 103 not  
24 voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the  
Council by Section 2 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-  
25 Laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe  
on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior  
26 on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18,  
1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by  
27 the Secretary of Interior and is effective as of the date of its  
enactment by the Papago Council.
