RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL (Requesting Aid for Sonoran Papagos)

1	WHEREAS,	the territory aboriginally constituting the home of the						
2		Papago Indian people, known as the Papagueria, was bisected						
3		by the International Border seperating the United States						
4		and Mexico which border was established by the Treaty of						
5		Guadalupe Hidalgo and the Gadsden Purchase; and						
6	WHEREAS,	there have been encroachments upon Papago lands and re-						
7		sources on both sides of the border, and such encroach-						
8		ments continue unabated in the State of Sonora, Mexico;						
9		and						
10	WHEREAS,	the Papago Indian population in the State of Sonora has						
11		been forced into half-a-dozen communities such as						
12		Pozoverde, San Francisquito and Carrizalito; and						
13	WHEREAS,	such Papago Indian communities have legal claims, both						
14		as a result of official land grants and of Spanish and						
15		Mexican law and tradition, to the lands and resources						
16		surrounding such communities; and						
17	WHEREAS,	despite such claims and grants, the Papago Indian pop-						
18		ulation in the State of Sonora is increasingly being						
19		deprived of its lands and resources, including water and						
20		wells, and						
21	WHEREAS,	the Papago Tribe of Arizona has established contact with						
22		the Papago Tribe of Mexico, thereby recognizing mutual						
23		concerns of the deprivation of resources, it is the						
24		interest of both Tribes to formulize other relationships						
25		to the mutual benefits and protection of both governments.						
26	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does							
27		hereby urgently request officials of the United States						
28		Government, including its diplomatic and consular re-						
29		presentatives in Mexico, officials of the United Nations						
30		and/or members of the United States Congress to have the						
31		governments, or appropriate officials, of Mexico and/or						
32		Sonora investigate the continuing encroachments against

NO. 44-79 the lands and resources of the Papago Indian population in the State of Sonora, Mexico; establish the right of the Papago Indian population in Sonora to the lands and resources, including water and wells, and its communities. The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 16th. day of May, 1979, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 862.5 for; 0 against; 202.5 not voting; and 1 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior 6∥ on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
