NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, The Papago Tribal Council hereby authorizes the Papago Education Committee to negotiate and enter a contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs and Health, Education and Welfare CFDA #13.588 for a Vocational Education Training Facilities Center and operational funding. The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 10TH. January , 1979, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 737.5 for, 185 against, 142.5 not voting, and 2 abser pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2. (a) (k) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe, as amended and ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
