

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Tribal Specific Health Plan)

RESO. NO. 71-79

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe is a federally recognized tribe, duly
2 organized with a Tribal governing body known as a Tribal
3 Council, according to the provisions contained in the
4 Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934; and;

5 WHEREAS, The Tribal Specific Health Plan encompasses a comprehen-
6 sive assessment of need and the resources that will be
7 required for fiscal year 1980-1984 in conformance with
8 P.L. 94-437, Indian Health Care Improvement Act, and;

9 WHEREAS, It is the desire of the Papago Tribe that the plan be
10 incorporated into the Sells Service Unit Plan, Area IHS
11 Plan, and National IHS Plan with its integrity and iden-
12 tity intact for presentation to Congress by the Secretary
13 of DHEW, and;

14 WHEREAS, The goal of the Papago Tribe through the development of
15 the Tribal Specific Health Plan, is to raise the level of
16 health status and health care of its tribal members to the
17 highest possible level, and;

18 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe will request the U. S. Congressional
19 Delegation from Arizona for their support to obtain the
20 needed resources to fully implement the plan,

21 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribe hereby approves
22 and adopts the Tribal Specific Health Plan, and supports
23 all efforts to be made in seeking a replacement for the
24 Sells Indian Hospital.

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of the Tribal Specific Health
26 Plan and this resolution be provided to the Indian Health
27 Service and Arizona Congressional Representatives.

28 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
the 24th day of August 1979, at a meeting at which a quorum was
present with a vote of 866.5 for; 0 against; 98.5 not voting; and
2 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by Sec-
tion 2 (a), (d), and (f), of Article V of the Constitution and By-
Laws of the Papago Tribe, as amended and ratified by the Tribe
on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior
on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18,
1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by

1 the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of
2 its enactment by the Papago Council.
