

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL  
(Building #405 Property of Tribe)

RESOLUTION NO. 96-79

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe proposes to use Building No. 405 that is a Bureau of  
2 Indian Affairs building, as a janitorial supply warehouse; and,

3 WHEREAS, it is possible via this Resolution for that building to be transferred  
4 by the Bureau of Indian Affairs to the tribe for use by the Tribal  
5 Maintenance Program in the performance of their work under the Santa  
6 Rosa Janitorial Contract; and,

7 WHEREAS, said Building No. 405 is located within the compound known as the old  
8 Santa Rosa School, is a cement block building; and,

9 WHEREAS, said building is in structually sound condition; and,

10 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe desires to use the building for storage of their  
11 janitorial supplies and/or equipment; and,

12 WHEREAS, said building and improvements are no longer used by the Bureau of  
13 Indian Affairs and should be the property of the Papago Tribe.

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that the following  
15 described building and improvements located in the compound in Santa  
16 Rosa Village, Gu Achi District, is hereby transferred, assigned, and  
17 set over to the Papago Tribe: Building No. 405, a 10' X 18' concrete  
18 block structure.


19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairman or in his absence the Vice-Chairman,  
20 and the Treasurer of the Papago Tribe are hereby authorized, on behalf  
21 of the Papago Tribe, to receive and receipt for any such facilities  
22 transferred or assigned to the Papago Tribe by the Bureau of Indian  
23 Affairs pursuant to the request contained in this Resolution.

24 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 7th day  
25 of December, 1979, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of  
26 965 for, 0 against; 0 against; 0 not voting and 0 absent, pursuant to  
27 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (d) of Article V of  
28 the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the  
29 Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on  
30 January 6, 1937, (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 19,  
31 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the  
32 Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary  
of the Interior.
