WHEREAS, The Papago Council did on February 3, 1978, by Resolution No. 3-78, authorize the entering into Intergovernmental Agreement(s) between 2 the Papago Tribe and the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors pro-3 viding for public service employment for members of the Papago Tribe residing in the San Lucy (Gila Bend) District, pursuant to the Com-5 prehensive Employment and Training Act of 1973, as amended; and 6 WHEREAS, said resolution No. 3-78 authorized the Chairman of the Papago Tribe 7 Я to execute such Agreement(s) on behalf of the Papago Tribe; and 9 WHEREAS, such Agreement(s) was in fact executed by Lucille Encinas, the Director 10 of Papago CETA Programs; and 11 WHEREAS, the Papago Council does hereby wish to confirm the execution of such 12 Agreement(s) on behalf of the Papago Tribe. 13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby ratify 14 and confirm the act or acts of Lucille Encinas, the Director of Papago 15 CETA Programs, in entering into and executing Intergovernmental 16 Agreement(s) providing for public service employment for members of the 17 Papago Tribe residing in the San Lucy (Gila Bend) District, pursuant 18 to the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act of 1973, as amended, 19 with the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors on behalf of the Papago 20 Tribe and as the authorized designee of the Chairman of the Papago 21 Tribe. 22 The forgoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 10th day of January, 1979, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1011 for; 0 against; 54 not voting; and 2 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2(a) of Article V of the Constitution 24 and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe, as amended, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937,

pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of Interior and is effective

26 as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
