

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL  
(HUD-CDBG PROGRAM PREAPPLICATION)

RESOLUTION NO. 99-79

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe of Arizona has been invited by the Department of Housing and Urban Development to submit a preapplication for a grant to fund certain eligible Community Development Block Grant Program activities and in connection with such preapplication resolve and make certain assurances;

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe, through the Papago HUD-Community Development Block Grant Program has conducted two public hearings for the purpose of hearing the needs of the Papago people under HUD-CDBG Program; and,

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council on December 12, 1979, prioritized the district and community requests in the following manner:

1. Housing Rehab
2. Bathrooms (Inside)
3. Community Buildings

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Housing and Urban Development Department, San Francisco Regional Office accept and consider this Community Development Block Grant pre-application from the Papago Tribe.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 12th day of December, 1979, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 936 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; 3 absent, pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 19, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.


