

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL  
(Topawa Village Post Office)

RES. NO. 10-81

1 WHEREAS, the United States Postal Service is operating a post office at  
2 Topawa Village which needs to be increased and improved; and  
3 WHEREAS, the site of said post office is on Tribal lands; and  
4 WHEREAS, the U. S. Postal Service has indicated a willingness to provide  
5 an improved facility for such post office at the existing site; and  
6 WHEREAS, the Baboquivari District Council did by Resolution No. 2-80 request  
7 that the U. S. Postal Service be furnished with the required permit  
8 or lease to provide such improved facility.  
9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Chairman or  
10 other appropriate officers of the Papago Tribe and the Department  
11 of the Interior are hereby requested and authorized to negotiate  
12 and issue a permit or lease to the United States Postal Service  
13 necessary to provide an improved post office at Topawa Village.

14 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 3rd  
15 day of February, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote  
16 of 965. for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 3 absent,  
17 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and  
18 (c) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of  
19 Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and  
20 approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to  
21 Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is  
22 not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as  
23 of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
