3	WHEREAS, the Papago Council did elect to apply for direct funding on behalf							
4	of the Papago Tribe to administer such programs on the Papago							
5	Reservation; and							
6	WHEREAS, the funds available to the Papago Tribe for such programs will depend							
	on the population served by the Papago Tribe; and							
7	WHEREAS, the most recent federal census substantially underestimates the							
8	population of the Papago Reservation and the Papago Council did by Resolution No. 07-81, protest such census; and							
9	WHEREAS, the records of the Department of Health and Human Services, Indian							
10	Health Service, establish a substantially higher service population							
	on the Papago Reservation.							
11	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it strongly urges							
12	the Department of Health and Human Services to use its own records,							
13	as shown by the service population of the Indian Health Service, to							
14	determine the actual population of the Papago Reservation for purpose							
	of computing the funds available to the Papago Tribe for Block Grants.							
15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Papago Tribe proposes to							
16	serve the entire population within the exterior boundaries of the							
17	Papago Reservation under programs funded by Block Grants through the							
18	Department of Health and Human Services.							
	The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the <u>8th</u> day of October, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of							
19	1148.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant							
20	to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as							
21	amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by							
22	the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to
