

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Small Farm Development Proposal of)
(Pisinemo Development Authority)

RES. NO. 134-81

1 WHEREAS, Pisinemo District initiated the Santa Cruz Demonstration Farm to
2 revitalize the agricultural economy of the Reservation and to provide
3 fresh local food; and


4 WHEREAS, Pisinemo District has organized a public body known as the Pisinemo
5 Development Authority to own and manage new District business enter-
6 prises, and to be fiscally and legally accountable for such
7 enterprises to the District and to the Papago Tribe; and

8 WHEREAS, the Pisinemo Development Authority has developed a Small Farm Develop-
9 ment proposal to provide funds for expending the Santa Cruz Farm to
10 40 acres, to set up an Agricultural Service and Training Center in
11 Pisinemo, to provide agricultural training for 48 Reservation resi-
12 dents, to start three pilot family farms, and to enter into agreements
13 with three other communities to begin community farms.


14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council supports the establish-
15 ment by the Pisinemo Development Authority of the proposed Agricultural
16 Service and Training Center in Pisinemo, and supports the Pisinemo
17 Development Authority in identifying funds as are available from
18 Federal agencies for agricultural development, on the condition that
19 such funds are not funds from which Papago or Vaiva Vo Farms, or other
20 Tribal agricultural programs are normally funded, and that the Small
21 Farm Development proposal will not compete for funding with any
22 current Tribal programs.

23 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 8th day
24 of October, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
25 1148.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent,
26 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d) of
27 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as
28 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the
29 Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act
30 of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by
31 the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment
32 by the Papago Council.
