

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Baboquivari Range Improvement Program)

RES. NO. 13-81

1 WHEREAS, Frank Harris presented to the Papago Council the petition of residents
2 of the villages of Choulic and Coldfields in the Baboquivari District
3 asking to have certain range lands surrounding their villages fenced
4 in order to protect these range lands from overgrazing; and

5 WHEREAS, the Papago Council heard the testimony of Frank Harris and other
6 residents of the villages of Choulic and Coldfields in favor of
7 the petition; and


8 WHEREAS, from the testimony adduced before the Council it appears that the
9 Baboquivari District Council has failed to enforce the District's
10 Land Code regulating the use of, and protecting its range lands,
11 and has failed to act on the petition of the residents of the
12 villages of Choulic and Coldfields; and

13 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has determined that it is to the benefit of the
14 residents of the villages of Choulic and Coldfields and of the
15 Papago Reservation as a whole that the request contained in the
16 petition be granted.


17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it supports the
18 petition of the residents of the villages of Choulic and Coldfields
19 and approves and authorizes construction of the range fence as
20 requested in the petition and as marked on the map presented to
21 the Papago Council, a copy of which shall be attached hereto.

22 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 4th
23 day of February, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
24 of 531. for; 159. against; 206. not voting; and 2 absent,
25 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (f) of
26 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as
27 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by
28 the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of
29 the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to
30 review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of
31 its enactment by the Papago Council.
