5		(Memorandum of Superintendent dated October 2, 1981); and
6	WHEREAS,	by letter dated November 17, 1981, the Area Director advised the
		Papago Council that he had rescinded the Superintendent's approval
7		of the budget, not because of any defects or omissions intrinsic to the budget, but because the Council had failed to list as "debts"
8		certain claims of the United States for "disallowed costs" under
9		P.L. 93-638 contracts and grants, and to list contingent liabilities
10		to a tribal account and to a tribal creditor; and
	WHEREAS.	the Papago Council finds that the attempt of the Area Director, by
11		use of the discretionary trust responsibility and authority placed
12		in the Secretary to review and veto tribal budgets, to force the
13		Tribe without due process of law to acknowledge and effectively
14		confess judgment to, and agree to pay such claims and contingent
		liabilities without regard to the existence of any defenses or set-
15		offs the Tribe may have thereto, reflects an improper purpose, was
16		influenced by extraneous considerations, and constitutes a capri-
17		cious and arbitrary abuse of power and an invasion of the congress-
18		ionally mandated intent, purposes and goals of tribal self-determina-
	NOW THE	tion and governmental autonomy.
19	NOW, THE	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to the power vested in the Papago Tribe by Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act, Act of June 18,
20		1934, and delegated to the Papago Council by Section 2 (c) of Article
21		V of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe, the Papago Council does
22		hereby direct that there shall be no further disposition or disburse-
		ment of tribal funds or assets in satisfaction or payment of
23		disallowed or misspent funds or costs under P.L. 93-638 contracts
24		or grants unless the Papago Council specifically approves of same.
25	BE IT FU	RTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby authorize
26		and direct the attorneys and appropriate officers of the Papago
		Tribe to institute and prosecute such appeals, proceedings or actions
27		necessary or appropriate to repeal, override or reverse the Area
28		Director's veto of the 1982 fiscal year budget of the Papago Tribe,
29		and to determine the obligation or liability of the Papago Tribe to
30		make disbursements of tribal funds upon claims of the United States for disallowed costs under P.L. 93-638 grants and contracts.
	RF IT FI	IRTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman, attorneys and other appropriate
31	DE II 10	officers of the Papago Tribe are hereby authorized to seek and obtain

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the support of other Indian tribes, Indian Organizations and their friends, in form of amicus briefs, legal services and funds, in obtaining a legal determination of the obligation or liability of Indian tribes to make disbursements of tribal funds upon claims of the United States for disallowed costs under P.L. 93-638 grants and contracts.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that pending a final determination of such appeals, proceedings or actions, the Treasurer and other appropriate officers of the Papago Tribe are authorized and directed to expend tribal funds in accordance with the 1982 fiscal year budget adopted by Resolution No. 122-81 of the Papago Council.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 14th
day of December, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1148.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
