WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe is faced with numerous problems resulting from the questioned or disallowed costs upon audits or close-outs of Tribal operated programs funded by grants from Federal, State or other outside agencies; and

WHEREAS, in order to avoid or reduce the amount of such questioned or disallowed costs it is essential that directors of tribal programs actively assure that their respective programs take the following steps:

- a) respond to audit reports within the time limits set by the funding or audit agencies;
- review the audit reports and determine the nature of corrective action needed to correct the deficient conditions;
- c) review the program operating procedures and records to insure that procedures and policies are revised/ improved to overcome the weaknesses noted in the audit reports;
- d) prepare and submit replies to audit reports with proof of corrective action taken, such as written policies and procedures established or memorandums written;
- e) follow-up corrective action taken on audit reports every three (3) months until all questioned costs and recommendations are resolved.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Tribal

Chairman and Tribal Vice Chairman and all Directors of Tribal

Programs are henceforth required to take the aforementioned steps in the administration of funded programs, and that in the event they shall fail to do so they shall be subject to reduction in pay, suspension, or termination in accordance with the provisions of the Papago Personnel Policies and Procedures.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 21st day of December, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1148.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (e) and (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of

Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
