

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Supporting FY 1983 Funding Appeal Statement)

RES. NO. 165-81

1 WHEREAS, the Honorable Ken Smith, Assistant Secretary of Indian Affairs,
2 has by Memorandum dated November 16, 1981, protested an OMB
3 recommendation of a 50 percent reduction in the Bureau of Indian
4 Affairs central and area office personnel, while agreeing to a
5 proposed cumulative reduction of \$6,749,000.00 for programs
which are on the tribal priority system; and

6 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has received an analysis from Tribal staff of
7 the Bureau's FY 1983 Funding Appeal Statement and disagrees with
8 many of the objectives and priorities expressed therein, parti-
9 cularly the Bureau's attempt to preserve administrative positions
and overhead in area and central offices at the expense of tribal
programs; and


10 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has and is experiencing difficulties with
11 partially constructed schools and is in support of a fully
constructed Hopi High School; and

12 WHEREAS, the Papago Council believes that there is a need to respond to
13 the Memorandum of the Assistant Secretary.


14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it disagrees with
15 many of the objectives and priorities expressed in the Assistant
16 Secretary's Memorandum and supporting FY 1983 Funding Appeal State-
17 ment, and accordingly directs the Chairman and other appropriate
18 officers of the Papago Tribe to prepare and submit a statement
19 reflecting the position of the Papago Tribe to the Honorable Ken
Smith, the Arizona Congressional Delegation, the Inter-Tribal
Council of Arizona and other Tribes and Tribal organizations.

20 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 29th
21 day of December, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
22 of 1148.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent,
23 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (f) and
24 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona
as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by
the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of
the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to
review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of
its enactment by the Papago Council.
