

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Childrens Home Contract - Social Services)

RES. NO. 20-81

1 WHEREAS, the Tribal Office of Grants and Contracts has presented to the
2 Papago Council as account of its negotiations of the F Y 1981
3 Childrens Home Contract; and

4 WHEREAS, it appears from said presentation that the Bureau of Indian Affairs
5 has been dilatory in negotiating the Contract; has failed properly
6 to comply with the regulations of the Department of Interior in
7 advising the Tribe that funds were not available to finance the
8 Contract; has failed to notify the Tribe of the unavailability of
9 funds before the Tribe had spent and was firmly committed to
10 employment and expenditure levels necessary for the Contract; and
11 has attempted to force the redesign of the scope of, and to impair
12 the level of services covered by the Contract without suggesting
13 alternative funding sources or attempting savings in and
14 reallocation of funds from other Bureau programs as mandated
15 by Department Regulations.

16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
17 authorize the appropriate officers of the Papago Tribe to amend
18 the original F Y 1981 Childrens Home Contract to a funding level
19 of \$86,000.00 with the direction and understanding, however, that
20 any unused funds under the Papago Tribes previous years' P. L.
21 93-368 Grants and Contracts, including without limitation funds
22 not used under the Papago Tribes F Y 1980 Childrens Home and
23 Rehabilitation Contract, be made available to the Childrens Home
24 by means of amendments to the F Y 1981 Childrens Home Contract
25 in order to assure that it will reach its' original funding
26 level (\$116,960.60).

27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby strongly
28 object to the dilatory tactics used by the Bureau of Indian
29 Affairs in the negotiations of this Contract and other contracts
30 with, and Grants to the Papago Tribe, and does hereby direct
31 that the appropriate officers and the attorneys of the Papago
32 Tribe do everything necessary and proper to assure that the

1 Bureau of Indian Affairs will in the future comply with the
2 provisions of P. L. 93-638 and its supporting regulations and
3 that the Area Office of the Bureau will in the future provide
4 the Tribal Office of Grants and Contracts with a list showing
5 every alternative source and level of funding available both
6 to the Area and the Papago Agency for any program which the
7 Papago Tribe either has under Contract or Grant, or for which
8 it submits an application, well in advance of the date required
9 of the Papago Tribe to submit requests for Contracts or appli-
10 cations for Grants.

11 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 5th
12 day of February, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
13 of 917. for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent,
14 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and
15 (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona
16 as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by
17 the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of
18 the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to
19 review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of
20 its enactment by the Papago Council.
