

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(State Justice Workshop)

RES. NO. 21-81

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council has been informed through an oral
2 presentation on February 5, 1981, by the Papago Children's Court
3 Judge, Ned Norris, Jr. and Fred M. Johnson, Administrative
4 Officer for the Children's Court, that there is an initiative
5 being implemented by the Arizona State Justice Planning Agency
6 to Remove Juveniles from Jails on Indian Reservations through
7 the Development of Alternatives to Incarceration, and

8 WHEREAS, the Arizona State Justice Planning Agency will conduct its
9 first training session February 10 - 13, 1981, and its purpose
10 is to develop and/or provide specific details to the following;


- 11 A. National Program Coordinators' Purpose,

20 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council has continued to express the need to
21 explore the development of such alternatives.


22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Council does hereby
23 authorize Ned Norris, Jr. and Fred M. Johnson to attend and
24 provide input as to the Papago Tribes interest and need to
25 develop Alternatives to Incarceration.

26 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 5th
27 day of February, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
28 of 779.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 4 absent,
29 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (e) and
30 (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of
31 Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
32 approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to
Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is
not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as
of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
