

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(National Jail Removal Initiative)

RES. NO. 24-81

1 WHEREAS, the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974 mandates
2 to States the removal of juveniles from adult jails and lock-ups; and
3 WHEREAS, the Act mandates to States the development of a flexible network of
4 service and placement options for alleged juvenile offenders and
5 non-offenders based upon; (1) the least restrictive alternative,
6 and (2) maintenance of a juvenile's family and community ties; and
7 WHEREAS, the Act mandates to States planning and implementation process for
8 removal which: (1) is based upon a recognition of youth rights
9 and due process and which promotes the advocacy of such, and
10 (2) uses active citizen participation and youth involvement; and
11 WHEREAS, the Act mandates to States enhanced capacity for parents, schools,
12 and police to resolve problems of youth in a non-judicial manner
13 and thus alleviate the use of jails and lock-ups. This includes,
14 where appropriate, the coordination and integration of public and
15 private child welfare services; and
16 WHEREAS, the Act mandates to States identification and description of viable
17 alternatives to the use of jails and lock-ups; and
18 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe of Arizona has expressed a willingness to
19 participate in the National Jail Removal Initiative and in the
20 provisions of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act
21 of 1974 where applicable; and
22 WHEREAS, the Arizona State Justice Planning Agency (JPA), the Community
23 Research Center (CRC), and the tribes are jointly developing and
24 implementing the initiative to remove juveniles from adult jails
25 in tribal jurisdictions.
26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Council supports the
27 National Jail Removal Initiative for removing juveniles from adult
28 jails.
29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that, without in any
30 way intending to derogate on or affect the independent status and
31 sovereign powers of the Papago Tribe, the Papago Tribe agrees to
32 cooperate with JPA and CRC in all aspects of the planning and


1 analysis phase of the Jail Removal Initiative and in the
2 implementation of the Initiative.

3 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 4th
4 day of March, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
5 of 965. for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent,
6 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (f)
7 and (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of
8 Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
9 approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to
10 Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is
11 not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as
12 of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
