

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Tribal Input - BIA Law & Order Funds)

RES. NO. 25-81

1 WHEREAS, there exists a great need for additional funds to increase the
2 effectiveness of Law and Order on the Papago Reservation; and

3 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has for several years brought this need to the
4 attention of Congress; and

5 WHEREAS, in response to the Papago Tribe's urgent request, Congress did
6 in its 1980 appropriations direct the Bureau of Indian Affairs
7 to add the sum \$175,000.00 to the funds designated by the
8 Department of Interior to support Law and Order on the Papago
9 Reservation; and

10 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe, acting through the Law and Order Committee, is
11 familiar with the Law and Order needs of its people as expressed
12 to Congress, and with the grounds for the congressional decision
13 to add such sum for use on the Papago Reservation; and

14 WHEREAS, it is essential that the Law and Order Committee be consulted
15 and have a direct input in the prioritization and allocation by
16 the Bureau of Indian Affairs of such sum in order to make sure
17 that it is used to meet the needs of the Papago people as
18 expressed to the Tribe's congressional delegation.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
20 request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to consult with and involve
21 the Papago Tribe's Law and Order Committee in its prioritization
22 and allocation of the sum of \$175,000.00, which was added in the
23 congressional FY 1980 appropriations to the funds designated by
24 the Bureau to support Law and Order on the Papago Reservation,
25 in order to assure that they are used to meet the needs of the
26 Papago people as expressed by the Papago Tribe to Congress.


27 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 5th
28 day of March, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
29 of 965 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent, pursuant
30 to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (d) and (h)
31 of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona
as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved
32 by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16
of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject
to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date
of its enactment by the Papago Council.
