## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL CETA Programs Funding - Budget Cuts

RES. NO. 26-81

1	WHEREAS, the Reagan Administration has announced proposed budget cuts of						
2	the CETA Programs for fiscal year 1982; and						
3	WHEREAS, such cuts will have a critical impact on Indian reservations and						
4	tribes where unemployment remains a chronic problem; and						
5	WHEREAS, the Papago Reservation suffers an unemployment level in excess						
6	of forty percent (40%), and the proposed cuts in CETA funding						
7	levels will result in lay-offs of an additional 200 adults and						
8	300 youths and will seriously impact on the economy of the						
9	Papago Reservation.						
10	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Tribe that it does hereby						
11	strongly urge Congress to resist the budget cuts proposed by						
12	the Reagan Administration and to continue the 1982 fiscal year						
13	funding levels for CETA programs originally proposed by the						
14	Carter Administration.						
15	The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 5th day of March, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 965 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) of

17	Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved						
18	by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject						
19	to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
