RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL (Soft Well Community)

1	WHEREAS,	the Papago Council did on March 7, 1980, receive from Representatives
2		of the San Lucy District the petition of over 150 Papagos residing
3		in the vicinity of Ajo, Arizona, requesting intercession by the
4		Papago Council on behalf of the Papagos residing on lands which
5		have historically and continuously comprised the Sand Papago
6		community of Soft Well (Mohik Vaya) and which lands are within the
7		boundaries of two unpatented mining claims ("mining claims"), Blue
8		Bird #8 and #9, located in the Ajo Mining District in the East Half
9		of Section 35, Township 12 South, Range 6 West, GSRB&M, in Pima
10		County, Arizona; and
11	WHEREAS,	the Papago Council did, by Resolution No. 16-80, request a deter-
2		mination of the legal status of said lands; and
13	WHEREAS,	it appears from a report of the Bureau of Land Management that said
14		lands are part of the public domain and have not been identified with
15		any of the Bureau's resource programs; that the Bureau would be
16		favorable to the transfer of such lands for use and occupancy by
17		the Papago Tribe; and that the lands are within the boundaries of
18		the Blue Bird #8 and #9 mining claims owned by T. J. Jones; and
19	WHEREAS,	T. J. Jones, recognizing the historic and continuing claim of the
20		Sand Papagos residing on said lands, did by a Mining Lease and
21		Option Agreement dated April 7, 1980, give the Papago Tribe a two-
22		year option to purchase said mining claims in order to give the
23		Papago Tribe an opportunity to seek legislative resolution of the
24		Tribe's claim to such lands.
25	NOW, THE	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
26		approve the attached Bill proposing that Congress reserve all
27		vacant, unreserved and undisposed of lands within the East Half
28		of Section 35, Township 12 South, Range 6 West, GSRB&M, in Pima
29		County, Arizona, exclusive of a tribal right to the minerals
30		therein, for use and occupancy of members of the Papago Tribe
31		as an addition to the Papago Reservation, subject only to
32	2	existing and valid rights and claims.

Page Two 1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Papago Council does hereby urgently 2 request Congress to act upon said Bill forthwith. 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Papago Council does hereby request the support and cooperation of the Department of Interior, and 4 5 specifically of the Bureaus of Indian Affairs and Land 6 Management, in the implementation of the purposes of 7 this Resolution. 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman, the Secretary, the San Lucy Representatives to the Papago Council, the Mining Director and 9 10 the Attorneys for the Papago Tribe are hereby authorized and directed to take whatever steps are necessary or incidental to 11 the purposes of this Resolution. 12 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 13 day of March, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 965. for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent, pursuant of 965. for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (d) and (h) 14 of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona 15 as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
