

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(CHR contract - FY 1981 with Phoenix Service Unit)

RES. NO. 31-81

1 WHEREAS, Congress has recognized the obligation of the United States to
2 respond to the strong expression for self-determination of the
3 Indian people by assuring maximum Indian participation in the
4 direction of educational and other federal services to Indian
5 communities in order to render such services more responsive
6 to the needs and desires of those communities; and

7 WHEREAS, Congress has determined that prolonged federal domination of
8 Indian service programs has served to retard rather than to
9 enhance the progress of the Indian people and their communities
10 by depriving Indians of the full opportunity to develop leadership
11 through skills crucial to self-government, and that the prolonged
12 federal domination of Indian service programs has denied the Indian
13 people an effective voice in the planning and implementation of
14 programs for the benefit of Indians which are responsive to the
15 true needs of Indian communities; and

16 WHEREAS, the development, construction, operation, provision, and maintenance
17 of adequate health facilities and services, including the training
18 of personnel for such work, and the planning, training, evaluation,
19 and other activities designed to improve the capacity of the tribal
20 organization to enter into a contract or contracts pursuant to the
21 Indian Self-Determination Act signifies the commitment of the Indian
22 people toward the improvement of the health status of American Indians
23 and the delivery of health care services to the Indian people in
24 accordance with the purposes and policy of the Indian Self-Determina-
25 tion Act, 25 U.S.C. 450, et seq.; and

26 WHEREAS, the Phoenix Service Unit Indian Health Advisory Board, Inc., is a
27 not-for-profit corporation composed of tribal representatives from
28 the Fort McDowell, Gila Bend, Gila River Districts 6 and 7, Payson
29 Tonto Apache, Salt River, Verde Valley Tribes, and Prescott Indian
30 Community, and is a tribal organization within the meaning of 25
31 U.S.C. 450 b. (c); and

32 WHEREAS, the San Lucy District has an appointed representative on the Phoenix

1 Service Unit Indian Health Advisory Board, Inc.; and
2 WHEREAS, the Phoenix Service Unit Indian Health Advisory Board, Inc., was
3 established to advise the Phoenix Indian Medical Center on matters
4 relating to the delivery of health care to tribal members under
5 the Phoenix Service Unit jurisdiction; and
6 WHEREAS, the San Lucy District Council has heretofore approved the letting
7 and making of a community health representative contract between
8 the Phoenix Service Unit Indian Health Advisory Board and the Phoenix
9 Area Indian Health Service for fiscal year 1981, said contract is
10 effective as of October 1, 1980, and has requested the Papago Council
11 by this Resolution to formally memorialize such approval and to
12 ratify and confirm such approval;
13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council hereby formally approves,
14 ratifies, and confirms the letting of the community health represent-
15 ative contract for fiscal year 1981 between the Phoenix Service Unit
16 Indian Health Advisory Board, Inc., and the Phoenix Area Health
17 Service, Department of Health, Education and Welfare, such approval
18 effective as to the date of the contract.
19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Papago Council supports and approves the
20 efforts of the Phoenix Service Unit Indian Health Advisory Board,
21 Inc., an organization performing services benefiting more than one
22 Indian Tribe pursuant to the purposes and policies of the Indian
23 Self-Determination Act, whose work is committed toward Indian self-
24 determination and whose work has been supported by the appointment of
25 a representative from the San Lucy District Council to the Phoenix
26 Service Unit Indian Health Advisory Board.
27 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 5th
28 day of March, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
29 of 965. for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent, pursuant
30 to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (d) of
31 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as
32 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by
the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of
the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to
review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of
its enactment by the Papago Council.
