

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Energy Crisis Intervention Program Plan of Action)


1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has developed an Energy Crisis Intervention program
2 to assure the establishment of energy related support networks in
3 weatherization, and the implementation of the Low Income Energy
4 Assistance Program on the Papago Reservation.

5 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
6 authorize and approve the attached Energy Crisis Intervantion
7 Program Plan of Action and budget, provided that sufficient funds
8 can be included in the budget to cover audit costs of the program
9 and that it be administered under the Tribe's central accounting
10 system.


11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby authorize
12 and direct the Chairman and other appropriate officers of the Papago
13 Tribe to execute such documents and take such actions as they deem
14 necessary and proper to implement the purposes of this Resolution.

15 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 5th
16 day of March, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
17 of 769.5 for; 156.5 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent, pursuant
18 to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (e) and (f)
19 of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona
as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved
by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16
of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject
to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date
of its enactment by the Papago Council.
