

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Adopting Position Paper for FY '82 B.I.A. Budget)

RES. NO. 41-81


1 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has reviewed the proposed FY 82 budgets and
2 programs of the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the budget cuts
3 affecting Indian programs proposed by the Administration of
4 President Reagan; and

5 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has heard from the various Departments of
6 the Papago Tribe concerning the effects of such budget cuts
7 upon the programs, employment and economy of the Papago Tribe.


8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
9 adopt the Position Paper dated April 3, 1981, concerning the
10 proposed FY 82 budgets and programs for the Bureau of Indian
11 Affairs, and directs that it be forwarded forthwith, together
12 with a summary cover sheet, to the President of the United
13 States, the Secretary of Interior, all Congressional Represent-
14 atives from the State of Arizona, all national Indian organizations
15 and to Gerard and Byler Associates.

16 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 3rd
17 day of April, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
18 857.5 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 4 absent, pursuant to
19 the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d) and (f) of Article
20 V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
21 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the
22 Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the
23 Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review
24 by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its
25 enactment by the Papago Council.
