RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL (Objection to Cuts in Indian Education Funding)

RES. NO. 64-81

1 WHEREAS, proposed budget cuts of the Reagan Administration threaten funding 2 for Indian education under P. L. 95-561, and will cause reduction 3 in the number of teachers, para-professionals and support staff 4 assigned to schools operated by the Bureau of Indian Affairs on 5 the Papago Reservation; and 6 WHEREAS, enrollment in said schools is already stretched to capacity and 7 teaching and administrative staff are presently pushed beyond 8 capacity. 9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it finds that 10 the cuts in the education budgets of the Bureau of Indian Affairs 11 proposed by the Reagan Administration are fully unacceptable to 12 the Papago Tribe and directs the Chairman and other appropriate 13 officers of the Papago Tribe forthwith to so inform members of 14 Congress representing the State of Arizona or having responsibility over the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and to take all possible action 15 16 to seek to preserve the funding levels originally contemplated by 17 P. L. 95-561. 18 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 2nd of June, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 175. not voting; and 1 61.5 against; 19 for; absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, 20 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
