

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Advising B.I.A. that Tribe will not Contract to take)
(over Law Enforcement of the Papago Reservation)

RES. NO. 93-81

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has entered into Intergovernmental Personnel Act
2 ('IPA') agreements with the Bureau of Indian Affairs to provide
3 the Bureau with tribal police officers; and

4 WHEREAS, the Bureau has reached the conclusion that the purpose of such IPA
5 agreements was to train tribal police officers in anticipation of a
6 Tribal take-over of all Law Enforcement Programs, services and
7 functions on the Papago Reservation; and


8 WHEREAS, the Law and Order Committee has advised the Papago Council that the
9 Papago Tribe is without sufficient financial resources to take over
10 the Law Enforcement programs, services and functions of the Bureau
11 at the expiration of the existing police IPA agreements with the
12 Bureau; and

13 WHEREAS, the Papago Council finds that the Papago Tribe is presently without
14 the financial resources necessary for such a take-over.


15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby advise
16 the Bureau of Indian Affairs that the Papago Tribe does not intend to
17 take over the Law Enforcement programs, services and functions
18 presently being operated and administered by the Bureau except for
19 such portions thereof as it presently has under P.L. 93-638 contract,
20 i.e., Detention and Dispatch Services.

21 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 10th
22 day of August, 1981, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
23 515.0 for; 606.0 against; 27.0 not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant
24 to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (d) of
25 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as
26 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by
the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of
the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to
review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of
its enactment by the Papago Council.
