

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
FY '84 638 Contract/Human Services

RES. NO. 10J-83

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe recognizes that it has a constitutional obligation
2 pursuant to Article V, Section I (h) to provide for the public
3 welfare; and
4 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe wishes to provide Human Services to its members
5 by creating a Social Service Program that will be a accessible to
6 all people and will provide quality services; and
7 WHEREAS, the Social Services Program is currently being administered by the
8 Bureau of Indian Affairs, Social Services Branch; and
9 WHEREAS, the intent of P. L. 93-638 Self-Determination and Education
10 Assistance Act is to encourage Tribes to assume more and more
11 responsibility over their programs; and
12 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe believes it is in a better position to provide for
13 the welfare of its members by developing a Social Services Program
14 which will identify and address their particular needs.

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribe, pursuant to the provi-
16 sions of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act
17 of 1975, P. L. 93-638, intends to contract with the Bureau of Indian
18 Affairs for the transfer of all Social Service functions currently
19 being administered by the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duration of this contract shall be from
21 October 1, 1983, through September 30, 1984.

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Josiah Moore, Chairman, Francisco Jose, Jr., Vice
23 Chairman, or Rosita N. Ruiz, Treasurer, of the Papago Council are
24 hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the contract and any
25 amendments thereto on behalf of the Papago Tribe.

26 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 7th
27 day of July, 1983, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
28 1440.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent,
29 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (d)
30 and (m) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of
31 Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
32 approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to
Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is
not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as
of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
