RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL Housing Improvement Program FY 1984

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Government established the Papago Skill Center 1 by Resolution No. 04-79, and O'odham Construction by Resolution 2 No. 58-80, both are 100% tribally owned and operated; and 3WHEREAS, the Papago Skill Center has trained 75 Papagos in construction trades since the Center opened in August, 1981, and proposed 4 to place its construction trades graduates with the O'odham 5 Construction; and 6 WHEREAS, the Papago Skill Center has constructed four (4) model homes with 7 the floor plans and construction techniques that are acceptable to the Union and the Bureau of Indian Affairs. 8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that it does hereby authorize the Papago 9 Tribe to enter into a multi-year contract with the Bureau of 10 Indian Affairs pursuant to 25 CFR 271.12 and 271.14 for the Housing Improvement Program (HIP). Contract term to be October 11 01, 1982, through September 30, 1985. The amount available for 12 FY 1984 is \$336,200.00. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the eligibility criteria will be as follows: 13 each District shall select one (1) participant and (1) alternate 14 pursuant to 25 CFR 256.5 eligibility. 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Josiah Moore, Chairman, Francisco Jose, Vice Chairman or Rosita N. Ruiz, Treasurer of the Papago Council are 16 hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the contract and any 17 amendments thereto on behalf of the Papago Tribe. 18 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 4th day of August, 1983, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote 19 1440.0 for; against; 0 not voting; and pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and 20 (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of
