1	WHEREAS,	on October 12, 1982, Title III of Public Law 97-293 (96 Stat. 1275)
2		Southern Arizona Water Rights Settlement Act of 1982 was enacted into law; and
3	WHEREAS,	the law provided for the establishment of a water management plan
4		for groundwater pumped from beneath the San Xavier Reservation and
5		that portion of the Schuk Toak District that lies within the Tucson
6		Active Management Area and that part of the Upper Santa Cruz Basin not within said area (eastern portions of the Garcia Strip and
7		Vaya Strip); and
8	WHEREAS,	the fiscal year 1983 Supplemental Appropriation Bill now pending
9		before Congress which could soon be enacted into law contains the
10		sum of \$50,000.00 for the establishment of this Water Management Plan; and
11	WHEREAS,	the Papago Tribe, the San Xavier District and the Schuk Toak District
i		should be involved in the development of this Water Management
12	NUEDEAC	Plan; and
13	WHEREAS,	the Act provides that the functions of the Bureau of Reclamation shall be subject to the provisions of the Indian Self-Determination
14		and Education Assistance Act (88 Stat. 2203; 25 U.S.C. 450) to the
15		same extent as if performed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and
16	WHEREAS,	the Bureau of Reclamation has never in the past been subject to the
17		Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act and does not have the mechanism or procedures to enter into a P. L. 95-638
18		Contract with the Papago Tribe within the necessary time limit
19		(fiscal year 1983); and
20	WHEREAS,	it would be in the best interest of the Papago Tribe if the Bureau
21	£	of Indian Affairs became the lead Agency for the development of the Water Management Plan so that the Papago Tribe could timely enter
22		into a P. L. 95-638 Contract to participate in the development of
23		this Water Management Plan.
24	NOW, THEF	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Council does hereby
25		request that the Bureau of Indian Affairs be designated as the lead Agency for the development of the Water Management Plan mandated in
26		Public Law 97-293 (96 Stat. 1275).
27		THER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman, Vice Chairman, Treasurer and
İ		Legal Counsel take all steps necessary to expedite the purpose of
28		this Resolution including preparation for entering into a P. L. 95-638 Contract within the time restriction required by law for the
