

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL


Re-Authorization of IMPL
Monies for Early Childhood Program

RES. NO. 136-83

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has consistently endorsed the concept of early
2 childhood education, and has encouraged the development of the
3 early childhood centers; and
4 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has been continually frustrated by the lack of
5 an adequate and secure funding base for operation of its early
6 childhood programs; and
7 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has learned that the U.S. Congress has deleted
8 funding requests for the pre-kindergarten programs for FY '84
9 and instead has directed the Bureau of Indian Affairs to develop
10 pre-kindergarten education standards before any consideration
11 will be given regarding funding; and
12 WHEREAS, the Early Childhood program will be unable to operate the
13 centers without funding from the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and
14 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has by Ordinances 01-82 and 09-82 appropriated
15 \$101,000.00 and \$31,377.00 respectively, to use in the interim
16 for operation of the early childhood programs during FY '83; and
17 WHEREAS, the funds appropriated have not been used and are still available
18 in the IIM accounts; and
19 WHEREAS, the early childhood program now faces a critical funding crisis
20 which will result in closure of the early childhood centers
21 without financial assistance from the Tribe.
22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Early Childhood Program is
23 hereby authorized to use the funds appropriated pursuant to
24 Ordinances 01-82 and 09-82 to continue the early childhood
25 centers during the FY '84.

26 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 8th
27 day of September, 1983, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a
28 vote of 1440.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent,
29 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 3 (a) of
30 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as
31 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by
32 the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of
the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as
of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and
is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
