5		the Papago Council has learned that the U.S. Congress has deleted

7		and instead has directed the Bureau of Indian Affairs to develop					
8	1	pre-kindergarten education standards before any consideration					
9		will be given regarding funding; and					
	WHEREAS,	the Early Childhood program will be unable to operate the					
10		centers without funding from the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and					
11		the Papago Council has by Ordinances 01-82 and 09-82 appropriated					
12	1	\$101,000.00 and \$31,377.00 respectively, to use in the interim					
13	1	for operation of the early childhood programs during FY '83; and					
	i	the funds appropriated have not been used and are still available in the IIM accounts; and					
14		the early childhood program now faces a critical funding crisis					
15		which will result in closure of the early childhood centers					
16	1	without financial assistance from the Tribe.					
17	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Early Childhood Program is						
18		hereby authorized to use the funds appropriated pursuant to					
		Ordinances 01-82 and 09-82 to continue the early childhood
