RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL Approval to Bid as Grant Recipient

RES. NO. 153-83

WHEREAS, Congress has authorized the expenditure of federal funds for job training programs through the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA); and 2 WHEREAS, the JTPA requires that Service Delivery Areas (SDA's) be designated 3 locally for distribution of the training funds; and 4 WHEREAS, Indian Reservations in Arizona have been designated SDA's; and WHEREAS, the JTPA requires that the Private Industry Council (PIC) select a 5 grant recipient to receive and distribute the funds in accordance . 6 with program plans; and 7 WHEREAS, the grant recipient may be a unit of local government or an agency thereof in the service delivery area; and 8 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe, JTPA Program has requested permission to submit 9 a bid to the PIC for consideration as the grant recipient; and 10 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe, JTPA Program is qualified and capable of administering JTPA funds in accordance with program objectives. 11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council does hereby approve 12 and give permission to the Papago Tribe, JTPA Program to submit a 13 bid to the Private Industry Council for consideration as the grant recipient for 83/84 JTPA training funds for distribution to the 14 service delivery areas. 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Josiah Moore, Chairman, Francisco Jose, Vice 16 Chairman and Rosita Ruiz, Treasurer, of the Papago Council are hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the contract and any 17 amendments thereto on behalf of the Papago Tribe. 18 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the day of September, 1983, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote 19 of 1237.0 for; 101.5 against; 101.5 not voting; and 0 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and 20 (m) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by 21 the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to 22 review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council. 23 THE PAPAGO COUNCIL 24
