## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL Supporting Resolutions of Parent Policy Council

RES. NO. 15-83

WHEREAS, the Parent Policy Council of the Papago Early Childhood/Head 1 2 Start Program has recommended (1) that funding to continue the 3 Child Development Associate Program be continued; (2) that the 4 Tribe disapprove the suggestion that Early Childhood/Head Start 5 programs be funded by means of block grants; and (3) that 6 appropriation for Early Childhood/Head Start be made for a 7 period of five, rather than three years; and WHEREAS, the Papago Council strongly concurs in the recommendations of 8 the Parent Policy Council of the Papago Early Childhood/Head 9 10 Start Program. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it strongly 11 supports the foregoing recommendations of the Parent Policy 12 13 Council, urges the Southwest Indian Child and Family Conference 14 scheduled to meet in March, 1983, to take a firm stand in support of these recommendations, and that the Resolutions of the Parent 15 16 Policy Council be submitted to the Conference. The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 11th 1148.0 for; against; 0 0 not voting; and 19

day of February, 1983, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (d) and (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
