RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL Construction of Jail Renovation Project

RES. NO. 161-83

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has by Resolution No. 160-83 requested the Bureau of Indian Affairs to contract with the Papago Tribe for the architectural and engineering portion of the jail renovation project; and

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe desires to contract for the actual construction work of the renovation project; and

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe intends to carry out the intent of the Jobs Bill to put people to work on construction activities; and

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe understands that construction activities for renovation of the Sells jail facility is not expected to begin until March, 1984; and

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe is concerned with any unnecessary delay in the renovation because the delay entailed endangers the health and safety of the prisoners in jail.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does authorize and request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to contract with the Papago Tribe pursuant to a P.L. 93-638 contract for the construction funds appropriated for the renovation of the Sells jail facility.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs adopt expedited procedures to negotiate and award a P.L. 93-638 contract with the Papago Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this contract will begin December 1, 1983, and will terminate on May 30, 1984.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Josiah Moore, Chairman, Francisco Jose, Jr., Vice Chairman or Rosita Ruiz, Treasurer, of the Papago Council is hereby authorized to negotiate and execute these contracts and any amendments thereto for the duration of the contract.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the $\frac{13th}{day}$ of October, 1983, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of $\frac{1440.0}{of}$ for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (d) of Article V of the Construction and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
