

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
Construction of Jail Renovation Project

RES. NO. 161-83

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has by Resolution No. 160-83 requested the Bureau
2 of Indian Affairs to contract with the Papago Tribe for the archi-
3 tectural and engineering portion of the jail renovation project; and
4 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe desires to contract for the actual construction
5 work of the renovation project; and
6 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe intends to carry out the intent of the Jobs Bill to
7 put people to work on construction activities; and
8 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe understands that construction activities for renova-
9 tion of the Sells jail facility is not expected to begin until
10 March, 1984; and
11 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe is concerned with any unnecessary delay in the
12 renovation because the delay entailed endangers the health and
13 safety of the prisoners in jail.

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does authorize
15 and request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to contract with the Papago
16 Tribe pursuant to a P.L. 93-638 contract for the construction funds
17 appropriated for the renovation of the Sells jail facility.

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs adopt expedited
19 procedures to negotiate and award a P.L. 93-638 contract with the
20 Papago Tribe.

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this contract will begin December 1, 1983, and
22 will terminate on May 30, 1984.

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Josiah Moore, Chairman, Francisco Jose, Jr.,
24 Vice Chairman or Rosita Ruiz, Treasurer, of the Papago Council is
25 hereby authorized to negotiate and execute these contracts and any
26 amendments thereto for the duration of the contract.

27 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 13th
28 day of October, 1983, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
29 of 1440.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent,
30 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and
31 (d) of Article V of the Construction and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of
32 Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to
Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is
not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as
of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
