RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL Designating Projects and Programs Requiring Federal Appropriations

RES. NO. 19-83

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has heard testimony concerning the most urgent 2 needs of the Papago Tribe; and 3 WHEREAS, the Papago Council is mindful of the fact that in the present economic climate it will be difficult to obtain Federal funds 4 5 and support to meet such needs; and WHEREAS, the Papago Council has placed special priority on Health, Education 6 7 and High School Construction and has designated, on the attached 1984 Priorities List, the projects and programs as requiring 8 9 immediate attention. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby 10 designate the foregoing projects and programs of the Papago Tribe 11 12 as requiring immediate action, and does hereby authorize and 13 direct the appropriate and designated officers and agents of the 14 Papago Council to submit testimony and evidence in support thereof, 15 and of other projects and programs of the Papago Tribe requiring the attention and action of the United States Government, to 16 Congress and the appropriate agencies and officers of the United 17 18 States. The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 17th 19 day of February, 1983, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1148.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 3 absengursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d) of **2**0 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
