


RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL  
Contracting of Architectual Design


RES. NO. 55-83

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has determined that it is sound educational,  
2 social and economic policy to provide all Papago students the  
3 opportunity to attend locally-convenient day schools; and  
4 WHEREAS, the Tribe has been working to meet this goal along with Bureau  
5 of Indian Affairs personnel; and  
6 WHEREAS, the Tribe has completed the initial planning for a new high  
7 school; and  
8 WHEREAS, the Tribe has been informed that there are sufficient funds  
9 available to enter into a P.L. 93-638 contract with the Division  
10 of Facilities Engineering, Albuquerque for the architectural  
11 design of a new high school; and  
12 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe will put out to bid and sub-contract the  
13 architectural design for a new high school; and  
14 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council authorizes the Papago Education  
15 Committee to make the selection of the architectural firm.  
16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby  
17 authorize the Papago Tribe to enter into a 12 month contract with  
18 the Bureau of Indian Affairs, pursuant to 25 CFR Part 271.  
19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs provide the  
20 Papago Tribe with any and all technical assistance necessary  
21 in the preparation of the contract.  
22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Max H. Norris, Chairman, Enos J. Francisco, Jr.,  
23 Vice Chairman and Rosita Ruiz, Treasurer, of the Papago Council  
24 are hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the contract and  
25 any amendments thereto on behalf of the Papago Tribe.  
26 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 8th  
27 day of April, 1983, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote  
28 of 1148.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent,  
29 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (e)  
30 and (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of  
31 Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and  
32 approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to  
Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is  
not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as  
of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
