

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
Hohokam Village Sites

RES. NO. 64-83

1 WHEREAS, the Arizona State Museum, University of Arizona, have identified
2 sites in the Tucson Basin, BB 1315, as Hohokam Villages, contain-
3 ing approximately 80 acres; and

4 WHEREAS, the Papago people are believed to be direct descendants of the
5 Hohokam; and

6 WHEREAS, the construction of a building for the Semi-Conductor Company has
7 partially destroyed the villages; and

8 WHEREAS, the preservation of the villages would be in the best interest
9 of the future generations by establishing the sites as historical
10 sites; and

11 WHEREAS, the present owners of this particular area of land have been
12 identified as the State of Arizona and the City of Tucson.

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
14 petition the State of Arizona and the City of Tucson to establish
15 and preserve the newly discovered Hohokam villages as historical
16 sites, also identified as BB 1315.

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Chairman and other
18 appropriate officers, agents and attorneys of the Papago Tribe
19 are hereby authorized and directed to take all steps necessary
20 to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution.

21 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 11th
22 day of April, 1983, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
23 of 1104.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 3 absent,
24 pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (e) and
25 (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of
26 Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to
Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is
not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as
of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
