RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL BIA to Select an Architectural Design Firm/Proposed High School

RES. NO. 71-83

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council did on April 8, 1983, authorize tribal officials to seek a P.L. 93-638 contract for architectural design 2 services for the proposed high school; and 3 WHEREAS, the Division of Facilities Engineering presented to the Tribe three options available for consideration; and 4 WHEREAS, the three options were presented to the Papago Education Committee/ 5 Board of Directors on April 28, 1983, for consideration; and WHEREAS, the Papago Education Committee/Board of Directors after reviewing 6 the options available voted to delegate the selection of an 7 architectural design firm to the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and 8 WHEREAS, the Committee requested tribal involvement at all levels regarding 9 the approval and selection of a firm; and WHEREAS, the Committee also voted not to restrict the Bureau of Indian 10 Affairs to the provisions of the Buy Indian Act; and 11 WHEREAS, the Committee further decided not to restrict the geographic 12 area for acceptance of proposals. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Council does authorize 13 and delegate to the Bureau of Indian Affairs the responsibility of 14 selecting an architectural design firm and hereby waives the restrictions imposed on the Bureau through the Buy Indian Act. 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Council authorizes the Bureau 16° of Indian Affairs to accept any and all contract design proposals 17 submitted from within the continental United States. The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 18 day of May, 1983, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 982.0 for; 0 against; 166.0 not voting; and 0 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (e) of 19 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as 20 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of 21 the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council and is not subject/to review 22 by the Secretary of the Interior. 23 THE PAPAGO COUNCIL 24 25 26
