RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL Amending FY '83 Tribal Budget to Provide Funds for Wise One's Elderly Program

RES. NO. 90-83

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe's Wise One's Elderly Program has incurred a a reduction in funding which has resulted in a forced reduction in working hours for employees of the Program from 40 to 30 hours per week; and

WHEREAS, such reduction has caused a strain on essential services of the Program to the elderly and the Council has determined that it is necessary to provide the Program with tribal funds in order to permit its employees to return to a 40 hour work week.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby amend the FY 1983 budget of the Papago Tribe in the amount of \$6,604.00 in accordance with the attached Wise One's Elderly Program budget in order to permit Program employees to go to a 40 hour work week effective July 1, 1983, and does hereby authorize expenditures of tribal funds in accordance therewith.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 6th day of June, 1983, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1440.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 3 (a) and (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
