

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Hickiwan District Revenue Sharing Budget FY 84-85)

RES. NO. 05-85

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has allocated Twenty-Three Thousand Seventy-Six
2 Dollars and Seventy-Three Cents (23,076.73) of federal revenue sharing
3 funds to the Hickiwan District; and


4 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has heard evidence concerning the use of such funds
5 pursuant to the requests presented at the public hearing, including the
6 attached resolution of the District Council of the Hickiwan District;
7 and

8 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has reviewed the attached budget and approves of
9 same.

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the \$23,076.73 of
11 federal revenue sharing funds allocated to the Hickiwan District be
12 distributed in accordance with the requests presented at the public
13 hearing and that it does hereby approve the attached 1985 revenue
14 sharing budget of the Hickiwan District and authorized expenditures
15 in accordance therewith.

16 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 09th
17 day of January, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
18 of 1,379.0 for; -0- against; 61.0 not voting; and -0- absent, pursuant to
19 the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) (f) (m) and 3 (a)
20 of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as
amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by
the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the
Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the
date of its approval by the Secretary of the Interior.


