

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Approval of FY 85 Contingency Funds
for Early Childhood Program)

RES. NO. 10-85

1 WHEREAS, The Early Childhood program has justified need for supplies, vehicle
2 insurance and training; and
3 WHEREAS, The Budget & Finance is satisfied that sufficient need and justifi-
4 cation has been submitted for consideration by the Council; and
5 WHEREAS, The FY 85 operating budget of the Early Childhood program can be
6 modified to add the amount authorized by Council; and
7 WHEREAS, The additional funds will be taken from the FY 85 contingency fund
8 and is intended to fund this new activity for FY 85 only;
9 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby and
10 authorize an amendment to the FY 85 Early Childhood department budget
11 in the amount of \$ 10,700 to be expended in accordance with the
12 budget and justification such amount to be taken from the FY 85
13 contingency fund as authorized;

14 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 09th
15 day of January, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
16 of 1,440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 3 absent, pursuant to
17 the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (f) (a) of Article V
18 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
19 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
18, 1934 (48 Stat 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its
approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review
by the Secretary of the Interior.
