

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL


(Approval for Request of Funds)

RES. NO. 12-85

1 WHEREAS, The Budget & Finance Committee has conducted its quarterly review on
2 FY 84 expenditures and the status of tribal revenues; and
3 WHEREAS, A savings has been realized from the FY 84 budgets which can be
4 obligated for other tribal needs; and
5 WHEREAS, Several tribal programs submitted requests for additional funds and
6 such requests were considered by the Budget & Finance Committee with
7 appropriate recommendations to the Council; and
8 WHEREAS, The Accounting Department has advised that it would be more feasible
9 to increase the FY 85 budgets of those departments requesting such
10 additional funds that to carry-over the identified savings; and
11 WHEREAS, The Papago Council can authorize the funding of those programs found
12 to have a justified need for additional funds from the FY 85 Contingen-
13 cy fund, and the savings identified from the FY 84 programs can be
14 reinvested for future use.
15 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby authorize
16 an amendment to the FY 85 Contingency fund, to decrease the fund by
17 \$14,100 to the Livestock and Early Childhood programs in the amounts
18 authorized by the Council; and that, the savings of \$760,700 is ap-
19 proved and directed to be invested for future uses;

20 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 09th
21 day of January, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
22 of 1,4440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 3 absent, pursuant to
23 the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) (f) of Article V
24 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
25 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its
approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review
by the Secretary of the Interior.
