

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

(Acceptance of Title II Grant)

RES. NO. 15-85

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Human Services department has the primary responsibility
2 to provide for the care, treatment and welfare of children found to
3 be of care;
4 WHEREAS, Title II of the Indian Child Welfare Act of 1978 provides funds for
5 development of child welfare programs under specified terms and con-
6 ditions; and
7 WHEREAS, The incidence of child abuse and neglect on the Papago Reservation is
8 high and available therapeutic treatment approaches are ineffective;
9 WHEREAS, The Papago Human Service department is capable of developing a cultur-
10 ally relevant program that will focus on relevant family therapy and
11 parent effectiveness training; and
12 WHEREAS, The need for such a program is well documented and Papago Human Services
13 is capable of implementing the programs;
14 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby approve
15 the application of the Papago Human Service for Title II funds to
16 develop and implement a culturally relevant Family Focus program which
17 will decrease the incidents of child abuse and neglect through the use
18 of a culturally relevant family therapy modality and parent effective-
19 ness training program.
20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Josiah Moore, Chairman, Francisco Jose, Jr., Vice-
21 Chairman or Rosita Ruiz, Treasurer, of the Papago Council is hereby
22 authorized to negotiate and execute these contracts and any a
23 thereto for the duration of the contracts.
24 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 10th
25 day of January, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote
26 of 1,440.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and -0- absent, pursuant to the
27 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) (f) of Article V of the
28 Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended, ratified
29 by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the
30 Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934
31 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval
32 by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the
Secretary of the Interior.
