

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Support for Continuation of Certain Federal Programs)

RES. NO. 187-85

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has learned of proposed budget reductions or
2 termination of programs in President Reagan's FY 86 Budget, including
3 termination of:

- 4 - Small Business Administration (SBA)
5 - Urban Development Action Grants (UDAG)
6 - Economic Development Administration (EDA)
7 - Job Corps
8 - Work Incentive Program
9 - Legal Services Corporation
10 - Indian Housing (HUD)
11 - Health Planning Funds/Health Professions Training Program
12 - Subsidies for school lunch and child feeding programs when
13 family income for family of four exceeds \$18,870.

14 WHEREAS, The Papago Tribe has participated in, or directly benefitted from all
15 of the above programs during their existence; and


16 WHEREAS, Termination of these programs will effectively frustrate the Papago
17 Tribes' efforts at self-determination and development in such key
18 areas as economic development, housing, legal services, job training
19 and professional career objectives; and

20 WHEREAS, Maximum participation by the Papago Tribe was just beginning and will
21 be denied if these programs are terminated;

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
23 strongly oppose the termination of the above listed programs and
24 urges the Honorable Congress to review the merits of the President's
25 justification for termination and restore full funding and authority
26 to continue the functions of these programs at the FY 85 funding
27 levels or at whatever level Congress deems appropriate.

28 The Foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 20th
29 day of March, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
30 1,318.0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 122.0 absent, pursuant to the
31 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (f) and (h) of Article
32 V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
the Papago Council.
