

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(Support of Continued Funding of Certain IHS Programs)

RES. NO. 188-85

1 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has been advised of proposed FY 86 funding re-
2 duction and/or terminations in many federal programs, including funds
3 for certain Indian Health Service programs such as the Tribal Manage-
4 ment Support, hospitals (new & replacement), outpatient facilities,
5 sanitation facilities and personnel quarters; and


6 WHEREAS, The Papago Council has consistently urged Congress to support and
7 continue funding IHS Programs which directly affect the delivery of
8 health care services to the Papago people and Indian people across the
9 Nation; and

10 WHEREAS, Any decrease, reduction or elimination of funding for any of the above
11 listed programs will adversely affect the health programs of the
12 Papago Tribe and frustrate the efforts of the delivery of health
13 services;

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby
15 strongly oppose any proposed reduction, freeze or elimination of
16 funding for Indian Health Services programs, namely Tribal Management,
17 Hospital (new & replacement), outpatient facilities, sanitation
18 facilities and personnel quarters and any other programs directly
19 participated in by the Papago Tribe and its members, and hereby urges
20 the Honorable Congress to restore all funding to those programs
21 proposed to receive reductions, freezes or be terminated completely
22 from funding, to the FY 85 funding levels, at a minimum.

23 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 20th
24 day of March, 1985, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
25 1440,0 for; -0- against; -0- not voting; and 02 absent, pursuant to the
26 authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d), (f) and (h) of Article
27 Y of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as amended,
28 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by
the Papago Council.
